Greetings Brothers and Sisters!

November is here, and like so many of you, I am looking forward to the end of the month and our family Thanksgiving dinner. I love

Thanksgiving, but lots of folks dread what's coming; Thanksgiving, then the Christmas and New year season. For lots of reasons, the holidays are not a reason to celebrate, but a cause for withdrawal and isolation. Many people lack the financial resources to observe the holidays in the culturally expected ways. It is a financial burden that fills them with anxiety. Others dread the season because they will spend their holidays painfully isolated and alone. I would encourage each of you to be aware of how holiday celebrations and observances impact our friends, family and neighbors. If there is an opportunity to invite, support and love them, without adding a burden to them, then maybe you should consider doing so (so long as it doesn't create an anxiety filled burden for you).

Also, this coming holiday season, we will be focusing on the paradox of value. What is really important about the coming of Jesus? And, how do we understand the economy of the kingdom of God is one of abundance, not scarcity? As a part of that theme, we will be asking everyone to find some small sacrifice they can make between Thanksgiving Sunday and January 9th (3 Kings Sunday). Say for example, you give up your Dunkin' coffee on Fridays, then set that money aside; you may have another sacrifice in mind (that's good too). On January 9th, we would ask you to bring what you have saved or set aside to the church (or mail in ahead of time) as part of a special offering to go to UMCOR for the Haitian relief efforts. The suffering there is catastrophic! What more appropriate way to honor our King, than to bring gifts that reflect our willingness to sacrifice for love's sake! I hope you will prayerfully consider participating in this endeavour!

1. **Christmas Blessing Bags** - We will be putting together 75-100 Blessing Bags this year. We will need the following items:

Winter hats, winter gloves, scarves, lotion, shampoo, body wash, deodorant, candy, snacks, gum, pens, note pads, \$5 to \$10 gift cards and anything else that you may come across. Right now Marlene is collecting things at my house as there is no storage at the church. You can leave the items in the grocery basket and she will pick them up. We can

meet as a group to put the bags together if we continue to wear our masks and social distance as required by the church. We will meet on Wednesday, December 1st 1:00 to 3:00.

2. **Christmas Food Drive** - Food items may be dropped off at the church any Sunday morning as the building will be open from 10:00 until 12:00. Marlene will open the building on Saturday, December 4th from 11:00 - 1:00 and Wednesday, Dec 8th from 4:00 - 6:00 for drop-offs. The small freezer will be placed in the narthex for any frozen items. The following items are needed for Christmas Baskets:

hams (not canned), small roasting chickens, frozen vegetables, instant potatoes, all canned vegetables (especially corn and green beans), gravy - or a \$25 gift card for Stop & Shop or ShopRite.







IMPORTANT information regarding in person worship!!!

- 1. Everyone must wear a mask in the building.
- 2. There will be no congregational singing until it's safe to do so (except during outdoor worship). Singing causes, us to express our breath in a way that significantly increases the chance of transmission. We would have to social distance some 30 ft making corporate worship impossible. We truly regret this. The Music Director, Chris Collins, will be working hard at finding alternatives for this activity, she already has lots of great ideas! When we worship outdoors, we will have congregational singing.
- 3. All who enter the worship space must sanitize their hands. If they leave the worship space to use the bathroom, they must re-sanitize at the door. We also strongly encourage you to wash your hands in the bathroom as well.
- 4. Entrances and exits are one way. Entry will be via the office door (on the portico), exits will be via the double glass doors onto the portico. Exiting for the bathroom will be through the memorial room door. No exceptions.
- 5. Offering plates will be available near the ushers on tables by the entrance and exits. The offering will not be taken during worship. Please make your offering as you come in or as you leave.
- 6. The chairs will be set up 6 ft apart in any direction. Only family members living in the same household may move their chairs to be next to one another. However, if those chairs are closer than 6 ft to someone NOT in their household, the family will have to make another arraignment to get their chairs together.
- 7. Starting May 16th, we will have a few tables set up (café style) for families to sit together. Please call in advance and let us know if your family would like a table.
- 8. We strongly urge everyone to maintain social distancing while in the building. This means there will be no fellowship/coffee hour. Please refrain from hugging, shaking hands and other behaviors that could potentially transmit the virus. We are not out of the woods just yet!



Corrine Colman, Pastor Dave Martin, myself (Tony Adamczyk), and Dave Lynch (a neighbor of Dave and I and frequent biking buddy) met with other bicyclists at Charter Oak Park for *Rotary in Motion* (RiM), a community outreach project of the Rotary Clubs of Manchester, Vernon and Bolton.

To remember and honor Kyle, a team had been created (Kyle's Crew) to walk the Boston Marathon route on Sunday October 3, as a fundraiser for the Jimmy Fund and Dana Farber Cancer Institute.
