

Greetings Brothers and Sisters!

newsletter. But there are times when it is god to take a moment and remember that though the kingdom of God has been proclaimed, it is here and not yet. It is always but coming. And until it reaches its fullness, we must work for a fairer and more just world. By the time you read this, the church will have held a special charge conference and will have voted on authorizing church leadership to discern whether we accept the settlement plan for the Boy Scouts of America (BSA) lawsuit. The lawsuit arose out of the sexual abuse within the BSA cases that have come to light. A class action lawsuit is (on behalf of those who have been abused) underway to extract monetary damages for the victims. Our church, as well as several other denominations that have had long standing associations with the BSA have been named as co-defendants by virtue of their having chartered troops or offering space for troops to meet. We voted to allow our insurance company (and by proxy their lawyers) to handle our defense, and shield individual churches from being sued. It's a tawdry and ugly process.

I, like other clergy I have spoken to, am very uncomfortable with the notion of letting lawyers decide what is just compensation, just damages if you will for the victims. Many lives have been destroyed by the predatory behaviors of men who were supposed to be trusted mentors and leaders of societies greatest treasure, our children. Money will not mend the shattered lives of these former scouts. So, in my moments of frustration with the process of administrating my two church charges through this litigation, I have stolen moments to stop and reflect on the emotional toil that has been unfairly inflicted on the innocent. I try and keep in mind that the facts and figures are just that. They do not accurately represent, nor tell the story of the very human tragedy that has occurred. In the weeks, months and years to come, try and remember the victims and the damage done to them. Pray for their healing. Pray too for their abusers. This one is harder, but Jesus commands us to "love our enemies and pray for them." In a very real way, these abusers are broken, and likely beyond the human ability to repair. Only God can mend what has happened. Our hearts should be filled with compassion for everyone involved, and not resentment or anger. Let this Advent/Christmas season fill your heart with compassion and mercy.




Christmas Card Mailbox

Right now Marlene is collecting things at my house as there is no storage at the church. You can leave the items in the grocery basket and she will pick them up. We can

meet as a group to put the bags together if we continue to wear our masks and social distance as required by the church. We will meet on Wednesday, December 1st 1:00 to 3:00.







IMPORTANT information regarding in person worship!!!

- 1. Everyone must wear a mask in the building.
- 2. There will be no congregational singing until it's safe to do so (except during outdoor worship). Singing causes, us to express our breath in a way that significantly increases the chance of transmission. We would have to social distance some 30 ft making corporate worship impossible. We truly regret this. The Music Director, Chris Collins, will be working hard at finding alternatives for this activity, she already has lots of great ideas! When we worship outdoors, we will have congregational singing.
- 3. All who enter the worship space must sanitize their hands. If they leave the worship space to use the bathroom, they must re-sanitize at the door. We also strongly encourage you to wash your hands in the bathroom as well.
- 4. Entrances and exits are one way. Entry will be via the office door (on the portico), exits will be via the double glass doors onto the portico. Exiting for the bathroom will be through the memorial room door. No exceptions.
- 5. Offering plates will be available near the ushers on tables by the entrance and exits. The offering will not be taken during worship. Please make your offering as you come in or as you leave.
- 6. The chairs will be set up 6 ft apart in any direction. Only family members living in the same household may move their chairs to be next to one another. However, if those chairs are closer than 6 ft to someone NOT in their household, the family will have to make another arraignment to get their chairs together.
- 7. Starting May 16th. we will have a few tables set up (café style) for families to sit together. Please call in advance and let us know if your family would like a table.
- 8. We strongly urge everyone to maintain social distancing while in the building. This means there will be no fellowship/coffee hour. Please refrain from hugging, shaking hands and other behaviors that could potentially transmit the virus. We are not out of the woods just yet!
