I find summer to be bittersweet for a few reasons. The first is that while there is lots of sun, and opportunity to do things outside, I could do without all the humidity. The second is that even though the days are long, the first day of summer (June 21st) marks the

progression of sun to the South and shorter days. I know, I know, it's a very pessimistic way to see things. Consider if you will every joyful and fun event in your life. When you think about weddings, birthday parties, vacations, you seldom think about the uncomfortable and anxiety producing moments the inevitably occur when we travel, or we are with our extended family. That's part of the beauty of human existence, we can forget, or rather selectively forget. Nietzsche suggests that a cow lives without boredom and pain, because it does not remember. Because it has no past, the cow is happy. Human beings, to be happy and have a future he argues, must let go of the past in order to have a future.

The Lord speaking through Isaiah (43:18-19) says: "Forget the former things; do not dwell on the past. See, I am doing a new thing! Now it springs up; do you not perceive it? God wants us to have a future, and has plans for each of us, but if we become rooted in pessimism, or the past, we are unable to see the new thing God is doing in our life. With all the last 2½ years has brought us (pandemic, war, inflation, political upheaval, a loss of human rights etc...) it is understandable that we may have trouble moving forward. May fervent prayer for each of you this summer is that you will live into the future God has planned for you, and meet these new challenges and blessings with faith, hope, and joy!

IMPORTANT information regarding in person worship!!!

- 1. Everyone must wear a mask in the building.
- 2. There will be no congregational singing until it's safe to do so (except during outdoor worship). Singing causes, us to express our breath in a way that significantly increases the chance of transmission. We would have to social distance some 30 ft making corporate worship impossible. We truly regret this. The Music Director, Chris Collins, will be working hard at finding alternatives for this activity, she already has lots of great ideas! When we worship outdoors, we will have congregational singing.
- 3. All who enter the worship space must sanitize their hands. If they leave the worship space to use the bathroom, they must re-sanitize at the door. We also strongly encourage you to wash your hands in the bathroom as well.
- 4. Entrances and exits are one way. Entry will be via the office door (on the portico), exits will be via the double glass doors onto the portico. Exiting for the bathroom will be through the memorial room door. No exceptions.
- 5. Offering plates will be available near the ushers on tables by the entrance and exits. The offering will not be taken during worship. Please make your offering as you come in or as you leave.
- 6. The chairs will be set up 6 ft apart in any direction. Only family members living in the same household may move their chairs to be next to one another. However, if those chairs are closer than 6 ft to someone NOT in their household, the family will have to make another arraignment to get their chairs together.
- 7. Starting May 16^{th,} we could have a few tables set up (café style) for families to sit together. Please call in advance and let us know if your family would like a table.
- 8. We strongly urge everyone to maintain social distancing while in the building. This means there will be no fellowship/coffee hour. Please refrain from hugging, shaking hands and other behaviors that could potentially transmit the virus. We are not out of the woods just yet!










Knitting Ministry

Bible Study



Covenant Disciple Group


Dear Brothers and Sisters,

From July 19 to September 20 Tuesday evenings from 6 to 8pm, instead of a Tuesday night Bible Study, I am asking that you consider being a part of a Covenant Disciple Group. What is a Covenant Disciple Group? It is a small group spiritual formation cohort with the purpose of encouraging one another in spiritual growth as we journey on towards perfection, as well as supporting one another as we struggle with the many issues that we might encounter daily. Ideally a group will consist of 12 people who are committed to attending at least 9 of the 10 meetings. If you don't think you can make that commitment, I would ask that you wait for one of the future groups to participate in. Part of the covenant is regular participation. You will need to be able to count on one another. My participation in the group is largely exemplar and eventually supervisory. In other words, I will lead in the beginning, and a few of you will in turn lead the group.

The format is simple. We gather for a potluck, then we gather afterwards for a devotional, a time of prayer, and then a time of personal sharing focused on the traditional Wesleyan question "How is it with your soul?" Of course, there are other commitments like daily prayer and scripture readings and personal reflection on Wesley's "22 questions" (he asks a lot of questions, doesn't he?) My is that 10 weeks of discipline together you will experience growth in journey with Christ, and have a deeper well of faith to draw upon. Please consider making this commitment. If the number exceeds 12, we will split into 2 or more groups as needed.

RSVP by July 14. If you are interested and Tuesday does not work for you, let me know, we may find a different day/time for a second group.
